PROGRAMS

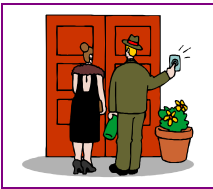

Along with his blindness, Lion Ross' health and mobility has decreased significantly since he was last able to join us at our meetings. Lion Bob relayed the information to Lion Gene Long and Lion Gene has taken it upon himself to figure out a way to make life easier for the DiSalvo's. There is not enough space to allow for an outside ramp; thus, a lift with a short ramp will be needed. This will then allow Lion Ross to remain in his wheel chair and move from his garage into his dining room. The cost of the lift and ramp will be approximately \$1,200. Lion Gene had originally planned to ask the Club to consider organizing/funding the project; however he felt that the timing is critical and approval, etc. would require several more weeks. Thus, Lion Gene has proceeded on the project, willing to organize and fund it personally. However, if other Lions are interested in helping to defray the cost of the project, please see Lions Gene or Shirley Long.

Benefit Breakfast is a HUGE Success

The Thurmont Lions Club, Thurmont United Church of Christ and Thrivent Financial for Lutherans held a Benefit Breakfast on March 21, 2009 for the “Callie Needs a Van” Fund – more than 750 breakfasts were served! Because the Thurmont Lions and Trinity UCC jointly absorbed all the expenses of the Breakfast, because people came from all over AND because people were so generous, the amount deposited from the Breakfast into the “Callie Needs a Van” Fund was \$9,577.26 – what an awesome birthday present for Callie (March 21 was Callie’s 8th birthday!) Our recently formed Thurmont Middle School LEO Club was also very involved – they donated \$150 to the Fund, made Happy Birthday posters for Callie and helped bus the tables at the Breakfast. One young LEO even took it upon himself to go out and sell candy bars “for Callie” – he proudly presented a check for \$50 – just look at our future Lions! The \$9,577.26 pot may grow even more – application is being made to Thrivent Financial for Lutherans who had committed “up to \$5,000 in matching funds” for the Breakfast. Thrivent is the largest fraternal benefit society in the country and prides themselves on “offering hope and help”.

The Benefit Breakfast was one segment of the overall fundraising efforts -- donations have also been received from other sources – the Emmitsburg Lions generously donated the funds they had received in memory of long-time member Lion David Martin, the Knights of Columbus donated funds in memory of a former mayor and several other Lions Clubs have donated to the Fund without even being asked. Numerous other individuals and organizations have also donated funds. A very special THANK YOU to Lion Gene Long (who has spearheaded the entire fundraising effort for Callie), Lion Frank Dardanell (who chaired the Benefit Breakfast), to each Lion and LEO who participated in the Benefit Breakfast and/or donated to the Fund – YOU have (again) shown compassion and helped make life a little easier for a family that has special needs.

Thanks to the very generous monetary donations from many individuals, churches and organizations and to the wonderfully successful Benefit Breakfast, the **TOTAL** collected for the overall “Callie Needs a Van” Fund (including the \$9,577.26 from the Lions & Trinity UCC Breakfast) has now reached **\$27,356.52**. The Watkins’ family is in the process of obtaining dependable, comfortable and safe transportation for Callie.

Again, in the words of Helen Keller, *“Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much!”*

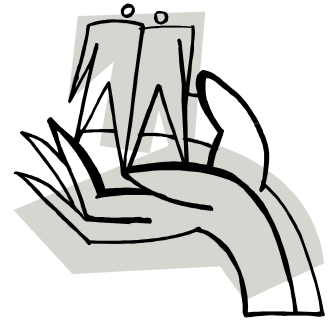
