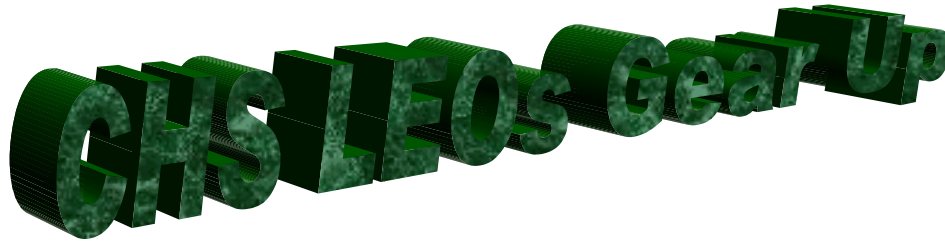


### **In The July Spotlight... Lion Lynn Stuart**

The club netted a profit of approximately \$1750 and sold 350 sandwiches. Profits came from low overhead expenses, many bulk meat sales and numerous donations. Because of the Fourth of July festivities the Antietam Ice Cream Trucks were otherwise deployed; but never fear they hopefully will return for the next two sandwich sales.

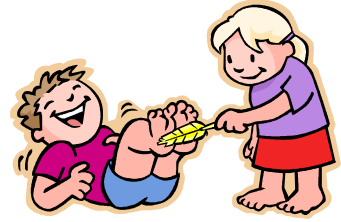

Southern Fried Snicker Sales at the Thurmont Guardian Hose Company's Carnival was also a big success this year. Throughout the 6 days of the carnival, we sold approximately 1,000 snickers and made a profit of approximately \$750.00. This was of course just a warm up for Colorfest where we typically sell more than 1200 deep fried snickers and several hundred twinkies and oreos in 2 days.

The Lions also provided food concessions for an estate auction in Frederick this month. Many thanks to Lions Paul, Shirley and Susan for helping coordinate this event. It was another successful venture with more than \$400.00 in profit brought in.

Weight Watchers will meet at 7 PM at the First Presbyterian Church. Please use large double door at the side entrance.

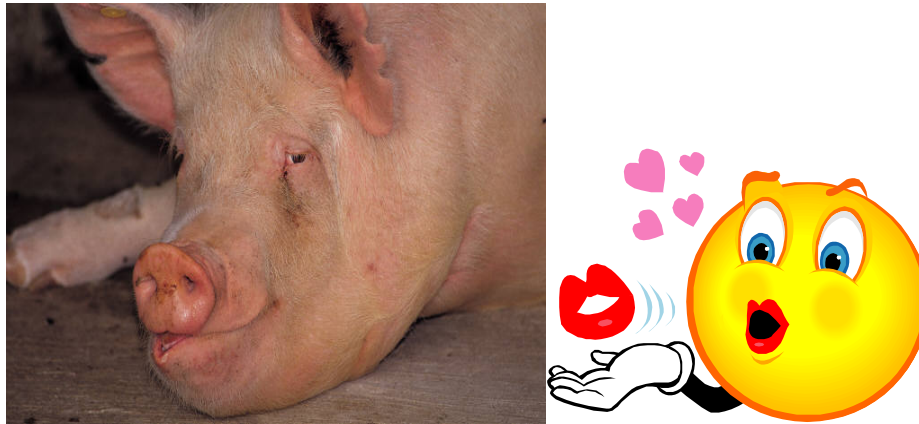

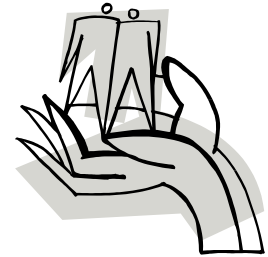
