November 25, 1949-August 27, 2011

No Thurmont Lion was prouder to be a Lion than Barry Glass. He got to know us two years ago this month when we came to his assistance financially soon after he discovered he had cancer in multiple organs. We laid him to rest on August 31st.

Responding to Treasurer Doug Favorite's recommendation, the Board voted to dedicate to Barry the proceeds of our September 2009 Sandwich Sale. Barry came to Bell Hill, stayed the whole day, and told me he wanted to be one of us. We promptly made that wish come true.

Thereafter, despite frequently intense pain and ups-and-downs of his chemo treatments, Barry came to every meeting he could make. Most of the time, he showed up at our food fund raisers, including setting up and tearing down for Colorfest and the Community Show, and he worked as hard as he could for as long as he could each time. He was there, alongside Lions Lynn and JoAnn, representing cancer victims everywhere during our 2010 Make-A-Difference-Day program calling for finding a cure.

Barry loved being a Lion because of what we do for others, and those acts of serving others matched beautifully with his giving, caring nature. Barry Glass was a devoted Lion, and his devotion is worthy of emulation by us all. He was also a friend who will be missed greatly. May he rest in peace.
