We made a profit of more than \$1,400, which while not a record, was still very good considering the large extra overhead costs that are typically expensed with the first sandwich sale of the season. ### ***July 4<sup>th</sup> Pit Sandwich Sale Right Around the Corner***

We have received approval from the Health Department to go back to a walk-up format for future events with a few minor modifications.

First, the ordering station, pickup station and a table between the two have been moved out close to the garage doors in the building so customers will remain outside during the ordering and pickup process. Second, we will be placing cones six feet apart in the queue line for customers to stand at while waiting to order. Third, we will be putting more picnic tables out in the field in front of the barn so that customers can sit down to eat and still be well distanced.

Going back to the walk up format should speed up service considerably again and will also allow us to resume more dessert sales. Also, by moving the ordering station, pickup station and a table between the two stations out closer to the doors

will give the sandwich makers more room in the middle. Since we are offering the picnic tables for folks to eat at, we will need to sanitize the tables as much as possible when a customer or customers leave. Therefore, we have added a new table busser position to the signup sheet. That job will involve using spray bleach cleaner and /or a bucket of bleach water to clean the tables after the customers are finished eating and leave.

We will be buying extra meat and rolls for the next event and with your help, we will hopefully have a sellout day again. Below is the link to the signup sheet for the next sandwich sale. Please sign up if you are able.

## ***Dues and Meals Can Now be Paid Online***

Since the launch of the “Members Only” section of the Thurmont Lions Club website, we have now included the option for making payments. Unfortunately, there have not been any meetings for which members would incur any charges; however, as we approach the start of the new Lions year, our annual dues will soon be “due”. If you would like to pay your dues online that will be possible; however, please remember that you must do so through the “Members Only” area of the website.

The “Members Only” section has the option to accept payments toward your member account. Some important notes to consider:

- Payments outside of the “Members Only” section will be counted as donations to the TLC Foundation. These payments go through a separate vendor. This is to keep the accounts separate. Donations to the TLC Foundation are tax deductible while payments to the club are not.
- There is a fee to process these transactions which the club cannot absorb. Therefore, the charge will be passed along to you. If you plan to pay online, you must pay using the “Online Amount” on your dues statement. This line includes the processing fee that we will be assessed.
- Once you start to make a payment to your account, you must complete the transaction.
- Payments to either the club or the TLC Foundation go through a third party vendor. That vendor accepts the payments and sends the funds (less their processing charge) to us. We do not see or know who submitted what, so you must fill out a small form that includes your name and the amount you are paying. Otherwise, we will not have any data to know who made a payment.

As of May 31, 2020, the ***Feed the Hungry*** campaign had a total goal of 2,728 items for this Lions year. Every dollar collected equals one food item. We have more than exceeded our goal despite the coronavirus pandemic. We also collected 181 hats, gloves, scarves and socks at the Christmas Party which were donated to the food bank.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic kept us from holding our regular club meetings, we did provide the food bank with prepared pork barbeque in 1 pint and 2 quart containers and 400 lbs. of potatoes over a four week period. TLC Foundation received over \$2,000 in donations for this BBQ project. After purchasing everything needed, there was an additional \$912 left over that was presented to the food bank by the end of June.

Everyone deserves a huge thank you for supporting the Thurmont Food Bank. A special shout out and thank you to Lions Tim Stuart and Evelyn Zimmerman for their generous cash donations this past year.
