

## Thurmont Lions Club – Make a Difference Day (2022-2023)

As club chair for our annual Make a Difference Day, I was presented with a challenge by President Julie. It is her desire that this year's project support the District 22-W Mobile Screening Unit (MSU) project. Since we don't yet have the actual unit to display, we finally decided on the following approach.

Starting in October, we will be running a series of articles describing the concept of the MSU and how it will benefit the residents of the surrounding community. Special emphasis will be placed on the ability of the MSU to screen for common health issues

such as vision; hearing; heart, blood pressure and diabetes. The articles will also emphasize the fact that we will not be making any actual diagnoses of problems but merely screening and recommending that people with potential issues consult an appropriate medical professional. We will also address the issue of pre-school eye screening events and how they can benefit young children.

The articles will emphasize the flexibility of the MUS to be set up at public events such as fairs and community

activities where it will be easy and convenient for people to be screened. As long as it is supported by both the Lions Clubs in the district and by the public, there will be no cost to individuals for the screening procedures. In conjunction with the concept of public support, we will identify a number of Thurmont Lions Club activities such as bingo nights, the annual health fair and our regular sandwich sales where people can make donations in support of the MSU. Appropriately marked donation jars, accompanied by a supply of MSU brochures, will be placed at these events for public donations.



While the collection of donations will support the operation of the MSU, the primary object of this year's MADD project is to make people more aware of the potential value of the MSU to the general public and the Lions clubs overall support of health issues with an emphasis on vision and diabetes.
